Bekah had known the family for years, two of Roy's children had been coming to her youth group called Shine. The second to oldest, Meka was one of the few girls who was being raised up to be a leader. Later on when we went to the states, Meka continued to lead Shine faithfully for the next four years.

When I met Roy he was in a dark place. After much prayer and many conversations we found something that he could do, play chess. He would go to our activity area, Subangan, and teach chess and play with the kids for four hours a day. He would take care of the equipment and and watch over the children in the shaded area, He would earn enough

money to buy some food for his family every day.

Over the years his heart outgrew his abilities and he would do extra things that he was not asked to do. Sweep, carry heavy equipment, and other things that he could not do (at least not very well). But it was hard to stop him with his big smile and loving heart. His faithfulness was also evident at the Church with Paster Ben who said that "Roy was always the first to church every Sunday." That says a lot when it takes you four times longer to walk. Roy is proof of the saying, "It's not what you have, but what you do with what you have that matters."

Out of our love for Roy and his family, we want to continue to support Meka by sending her to college. She is bright and a natural leader. Sending her will equip her to help break the cycle of poverty. Her monthly costs are \$440/mo for tuition, room and board. Please let us know if you want to help.
